FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fall weather means an increase in outdoor activity, which for many means outdoor grilling and fire pits. The Fire Department would like to share a few safety messages with you to ensure that these activities remain fun and do not end in tragedy.

When grilling, please ensure that your grill, smoker, or other outdoor cooking appliances are at least ten feet away from your home, garage, and other combustibles. 10,600 home fires are started by grills each year. Also make sure that you have adequate clearance from walkways and children. 19,700 patients are seen in Emergency Rooms from injuries involving grilling. (National Fire Protection Association).

While open burning is prohibited by the Ohio EPA, the Ohio Fire Code, and the Village of Lockland Codified Ordinances, contained fires in an approved device "fire pit" are okay for non-commercial, recreational purposes. Prior to lighting your fire pit, please ensure that there is not a burn ban or high wind advisory in affect. Ensure that your approved device is at least 15 feet from any structure. Only burn clean, dry, and seasoned firewood. Fire pits cannot be used to dispose of yard waste or other materials. Burning of yard waste is not permitted.
